





Expanded Devoted to be a two-day event instead of one!


Every year LOVEboldly hosts Devoted—a training event for church leaders who desire to give better pastoral care to LGBTQ+ people.

27%


said they will host a similar training or dialogue event about caring for LGBTQ+ people in their church

Consult Process

PHASE 1

Leadership Discernment

We equip your lead team to understand their own challenges and strengths and provide training and resources so your leaders are ready to lead the conversation.

PHASE 3

Decision and Roll-out

We equip your church to communicate and implement your new policies and procedures on LGBTQ+ care and/or inclusion.

PHASE 2

Congregational Conversation

We roll out our custom survey to your congregation and set the stage for a productive community conversation on faith, sexuality, and gender identity.

PHASE 4

Challenges and Barriers
